2008 Playing Conditions

All the Summer League matches scheduled by BACA, shall be played as per ICC's Playing Conditions for One-Day Internationals. The ICC's Playing Conditions for One-Day Internationals shall be superseded by the following BACA specific playing conditions.

11.1 Registration Fee.

1. The registration fee for 2008 Summer League is US \$550.00.
2. Last date by which BACA must receive the registration application along with registration fee for 2008 Summer League is March 22, 2008.
3. Arrears from previous year(s), if any, along with the penalties assessed must also be paid before or along with the registration application.
4. Failure to pay arrears:
Failure to pay the previous year's dues and or fines levied against the club/team:
 - (a) Automatically disqualifies the team for a minimum of one year.
 - (b) Automatically disqualifies the team's executive body (including but not limiting to President/Chairman/CEO, vice-president/vice-chairman, secretary, captain, vice captain, treasurer, BACA council member) from any BACA activities for a minimum of one year.
 - (c) Arrears from the previous year(s), if any, along with the penalties assessed must also be paid before any of the team executives can participate in BACA activities after disqualification

11.2 Ground

1. Open grass field big enough to mark more than sixty yards boundary around the pitch.
2. In order to be scheduled for the league matches, each team shall arrange their home playing field.
3. For restriction on placement of fieldsmen, refer 11.6.6.

11.3 Restrooms

1. Reasonably conveniently located rest rooms.
2. Host team shall arrange the restroom if not provided by the field authorities.

11.4 Pitch

1. Smooth hard surface with standard cricket pitch dimensions and clearly marked crease markings.
2. Concrete, asphalt or matting surface may be used if desired.
3. Set wide ball markers, 30" from middle stump on each side (Rt. & Lt hand batsmen), to help wide ball calls on the off side.

11.5 Ground Preparation & Match Readiness

1. General

- (a) It is the sole responsibility of home team to prepare and have the field available to the umpires at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start time of the match.
- (b) Any questions, concerns or objections in regard to the field preparation from Visiting Captain may only be brought to the attention of umpires and addressed by the umpire(s) prior to the start of the match.
- (c) Unless pointed out and specified by the umpire(s), no alteration may be carried out by the visitors to the existing setup.
- (d) Once field is handed over to the umpire(s) neither host nor may visitors be allowed to make any changes to the existing setup without notifying and getting consent of the umpire(s).
- (e) Any restrictions in regard to field use must be brought to the attention of umpire(s) in the presence of Visiting Captain by the Home Captain prior to or at the time of Toss.

2. Penalties

- (a) If the ground is not ready or minimum of seven (7) players of the home team are not present in the field by the scheduled start time, the home team shall be fined one over every five minutes for up to thirty (30) minutes.
- (b) If after the expiration of thirty (30) minutes the ground is still not ready or minimum of seven (7) players from home team are not present in the field, the match shall be considered forfeited and full points be awarded to the visiting team.

- (c) The visiting team shall be fined one over every five minutes for up to thirty (30) minutes if minimum of seven (7) players are not present in the field by the scheduled start time.
- (d) If after the expiration of thirty (30) minutes, minimum of seven (7) players from visiting team are not present in the field, the match shall be considered forfeited and full points are awarded to the home team.
- (e) In any of the situations given in b and d above, both the umpires (one by each club) shall be paid in full by involved clubs directly or via BACA.
- (f) Refer to 11.14 & "Appendix A" for penalties resulting from forfeiture of scheduled games

11.6 **League Matches**

1. **Days:**

The BACA league matches shall be played on Saturdays and or Sundays.

2. **Duration of Matches**

One-Day Matches shall be of one day's scheduled duration. The matches will consist of one innings per side and each innings will be limited to 40 six-ball overs. A minimum of 20 overs per team shall constitute a match.

3. **Hours of Play, Intervals and Minimum Overs in the Day**

(a) **Start and Cessation Times:**

The matches shall start at 11:00 am local time and there will be 2 sessions of 3 hours each separated by a 40 minutes break.

(b) **Interval between Innings:**

The Innings of the team batting second shall not commence before the scheduled time for the commencement of the second session unless the team batting first has completed its innings at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled interval, in which case a ten minute break will occur and the team batting second will commence its innings and the interval will occur as scheduled.

Where play is delayed or interrupted the umpires will reduce the length of the interval as follows:

Time Lost	Interval
Up to 60 minutes	30 minutes
Between 60 and 120 minutes	20 minutes
More than 120 minutes ¹	10 minutes

(c) **Intervals for Drinks:**

Two drinks breaks per session shall be permitted, each 1 hour apart, the provisions of Law 16.6 shall be strictly observed except that under conditions of extreme heat the Umpires may permit extra intervals for drinks. An individual player may be given a drink either on the boundary edge or at the fall of a wicket, on the field, provided that no playing time is wasted. No other drinks shall be taken onto the field without the permission of the umpires. Any player taking drinks onto the field shall be dressed in proper cricket attire.

4. **Length of Innings:**

(a) **Uninterrupted Matches:**

- 1. Each team shall bat for 40 (six ball) overs unless all out earlier. A team shall not be permitted to declare its innings closed.
- 2. If the team fielding first fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for cessation of the first session, play shall continue until the required number of overs has been bowled. Unless otherwise determined by the umpire(s), the innings of the team batting second shall be limited to the same number of overs bowled by it, at the scheduled time for cessation of the first session. The over in progress at the scheduled cessation time shall count as a completed over.

The interval shall not be extended and the second session shall commence at the scheduled time.

The umpires may increase the number of overs to be bowled by the team bowling second, if they are of the opinion that events beyond the control of the team bowling first prevented them

from bowling the required number of overs by the scheduled time for the cessation of the innings of the team batting first.

3. If the team batting first is all out and the last wicket falls at or after the scheduled time for the interval, the innings of the team batting second shall be limited to the same number of overs bowled to the team batting first at the scheduled time for the interval (the over in which the last wicket falls to count as a complete over).
4. If the team batting first is dismissed in less than 40 overs, the team batting second shall be entitled to bat for 40 overs except as provided in 3 above.
5. If the team fielding second fails to bowl 40 overs or the number of overs as provided in 2, 3, & 4 above by the scheduled cessation time, the hours of play shall be extended until the required number of overs has been bowled or a result achieved. In addition, a penalty of \$25 for each 15 minutes shall be levied against the team fielding second.

(b) Delayed or Interrupted Matches:

1. General

- (a) The object shall always be to rearrange the number of overs so that both teams have an opportunity of batting for the same number of overs. A team shall not be permitted to declare its innings closed.

A minimum of 20 overs have to be bowled to the side batting second to constitute a match subject to the provisions of Clause 11.6.4 (a) (2).

The calculation of the number of overs to be bowled shall be based on an average rate of 14.28 overs per hour in the total time available for play. If a reduction of the number of overs is required, any recalculation must not cause the match to be rescheduled to finish earlier than the original cessation time. This time may be extended to allow for one extra over for both teams to be added if required.

- (b) If the team fielding second fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled cessation time, the hours of play shall be extended until the overs have been bowled or a result achieved.
- (c) The team batting second shall not bat for a greater number of overs than the first team unless the later has been all out in less than the agreed number of overs.
- (d) Fractions are to be ignored in all calculations for the number of overs.

2. Delay or Interruption to the Innings of the Team batting first:

- (a) If the number of overs of the team batting first is reduced, a fixed time will be specified for the completion of the first session.
- (b) If the team fielding first fails to bowl the required number of overs by the scheduled time for cessation of the first session, play shall continue until the required number of overs has been bowled. And 11.6.4 (a) (2) shall apply.
- (c) If the team batting first is all out and the last wicket falls at or after the scheduled time for the interval, 11.6.4 (a) (3) shall apply.

3. Delay or Interruption to the Innings of the Team batting second:

If there is a suspension in play during the second session, the overs shall be reduced at a rate of 14.28 overs per hour for time lost, except that, when the innings of the team batting first has been completed prior to the scheduled or rescheduled time for the interval between innings, the reduction of overs will not commence until an amount of time equivalent to that by which the second innings started early has elapsed.

(c) Bad Light

Since 20 overs constitute a game, if umpires decide that the light is bad and play cannot continue and 20 overs in the second innings have not been bowled, the game will have to be rescheduled.

(d) Inclement Weather

In case of inclement weather, only an officiating umpire can call off a game. The match shall not be rescheduled and both teams will split points evenly.

5. Attire

- (a) Unless specified, all matches must be played in Standard White Cricket Attire.
- (b) Umpires may not allow any player to take the field without proper attire.

6. Restrictions on the Placement of Fieldsmen:

- (a) At the instance of delivery, there may not be more than 5 fielders on the leg side.
- (b) In addition to the restriction contained in clause 11.5.1 (e) above, further fielding restrictions shall apply to certain overs in each innings. The nature of such fielding restrictions and the overs during which they shall apply (hereinafter referred to as the Fielding Restriction Overs) are set out in the following paragraphs.
- (c) Two semi-circles shall be drawn on the field of play. The semi-circles shall have as their centre the middle stump at either end of the pitch. The radius of each of the semi-circles shall be 30 yards (27.43 meters). The semi-circles shall be linked by two parallel straight lines drawn on the field. The fielding restriction areas should be marked by continuous painted white lines or 'dots' at 5 yard (4.57 meters) intervals, each 'dot' to be covered by a plastic or rubber (but not metal) disc measuring 7 inches (18 cm) in diameter. During the Fielding Restriction Overs (as set out below), only two fieldsmen shall be permitted outside this fielding restriction area at the instant of delivery. Only two fielders are allowed to be present behind the popping crease at any time.
- (d) For the first 12 overs only two fieldsmen are permitted to be outside the fielding restriction area at the instance of delivery.
- (e) During the non Fielding Restriction Overs, only five fieldsmen (irrespective of total number of fielders) are permitted to be outside the fielding restriction area at the instance of delivery. To further clarify, if a team is playing with 10 players, it will still be allowed to take five fieldsmen outside (three fieldsmen inside) the fielding restriction area after the field restriction overs.
- (f) In circumstances where the number of overs for the batting team is reduced, the number of overs in regard to the restrictions above shall be reduced proportionally in a ratio of 15:50 (30%) in accordance with the table below. Fractions are to be ignored in all calculations for the number of overs.

Total overs in innings	No. of overs for which fielding restrictions shall apply
20 – 23	6
24 – 26	7
27 – 29	8
30 – 33	9
34 – 36	10
37 – 40	12

- (g) Where, in an interrupted innings, on resumption the recalculated number of Fielding Restriction Overs (as set out above) is no longer achievable, the actual number of Fielding Restriction Overs for that innings will be the closest achievable whole number.
- (h) In the event of an infringement, the square leg umpire shall call and signal 'No Ball'.

7. Number of Overs per Bowler:

No bowler shall bowl more than 8 (six-ball) overs in an innings. In a delayed or interrupted match where the overs are reduced for both teams or for the team bowling second, no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed. Where the total overs are not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the maximum number per bowler necessary to make up the balance.

In the event of a bowler breaking down and being unable to complete an over, another bowler will bowl the remaining balls. Such part of an over will count as a full over only in so far as each bowler's limit is concerned. The scorecard shall show the total number of overs bowled and the number of overs bowled by each bowler.

11.7 Lunch & Refreshment:

1. The home team shall provide refreshments for both teams and umpires.
2. The home team shall provide the lunch for both teams and umpires unless otherwise agreed upon by both teams. However, the home team will always be responsible for providing lunch to the umpires.

11.8 Player Intra Club movement:

1. Any player may choose to leave his team (Team 'A') to join any other team (Team 'B') at anytime, but may not come back and play for the team he left (Team 'A') or play for any other club thereafter during any given season and BACA must be notified within seven (7) days of his / her move.
2. A player may not play for more than Two (2) teams during any given season.
3. 11.8.1 & 11.8.2 are not applicable to any player who is under the age of 19 on the day of first scheduled match of the Summer League season. A player, who falls into this category, can move between multiple teams without any restrictions.
4. For statistical purpose and awards, players' stats from more than one club will not be combined.

11.9 Score Sheets / Reports

1. White copy of completed & signed score sheets along with completed and signed umpiring reports shall be mailed by the winning team to "**Manjit Saini, 967 Ketch Pl, San Jose, CA 95133**" within seven days from the completion of the match to avoid penalties as outlined in Section 11.22.
2. All reportable disciplinary issues shall be filled with the Secretary of BACA within seven days of the observance of the occurrence(s).

Also refer section 11.22 Points & Penalties

11.10 Umpiring

1. **General**

- (a) BACA League Monitoring Committee or its subordinate committee shall allocate the umpiring responsibilities.
- (b) Every team in BACA will be provided with one umpiring jacket and one umpire counter. The jackets and counters are BACA's property and must be returned to BACA when the team ends its participation in BACA Summer League. During a match, each team will have to provide one jacket and one counter to each of the umpires. If a team fails to do so, the umpires must report to the league about it so that appropriate action can be taken.
- (c) Umpires must not let any player to take the field without the proper attire for the event he is umpiring for.
- (d) Umpires from all participating teams will be identified and grouped into Pool A and Pool B depending on experience in umpiring league matches as well as taking into consideration the inputs from various teams in the past. Umpires from Pool B can only stand in as leg umpire. The league will try to assign two umpires from Pool A for all the games but depending on availability, it may assign one umpire from each Pool for a match.
- (e) In cases where only one umpire from Pool A is available for a match, the match shall proceed. But in this case, the batting team must provide a leg umpire. However, the leg umpire must be a part of Pool A or Pool B for that team.
- (f) No match shall be played without the presence of at least one neutral umpire from Pool A. In this case, the match shall be re-scheduled by the teams involved. *See 11.11, Match Re-scheduling*
- (g) Anyone holding a proof as ICC certified umpire may be allowed to umpire BACA matches.

2. **Umpiring Fee**

- (a) The umpiring fee shall be US \$66.00 per umpire, for umpires from Pool A.
- (b) The umpiring fee shall be US \$88.00 for the umpire from Pool A and US \$44.00 for the umpire from Pool B when a match is being umpired by one umpire from each Pool.
- (c) The umpiring fee shall be US \$110.00 when only one umpire from Pool A is umpiring a match and there is no neutral leg umpire. In this case, both playing teams will pay the umpire US \$55.00 each. If any dispute arises while the leg umpire is from batting team, the main umpire will take the final decision after taking the circumstances into consideration. The leg umpires provided by batting sides will not be paid any amount.
- (d) Once on the field, the umpires must be paid in full by the team(s) present prior to start of the game.
- (e) If one team is a no-show (treated as a forfeiture, refer Appendix A for penalties), the other team present shall pay both umpires. BACA shall reimburse the paying team for one umpire's fee and will be billing the non-show team for the same.
- (f) In case a game is not played due to inclement weather and the umpires made the decision after going to the ground, the umpires for such a game can request BACA to pay them their umpiring fees.

3. Umpiring Penalties (also refer section 11.22)

- (a) The umpires are encouraged to be present in the field at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start time.
- (b) If a team fails to provide umpiring jacket or counter, the team will be penalized with points as mentioned in "Appendix A".
- (c) As long as at least one umpire from Pool A is on the field no later than 30 minutes after the scheduled start time, the match will proceed.
- (d) If no umpire from Pool A arrives within 30 minutes of the scheduled start time, the match will not be played and game shall be re-scheduled and played prior to the start of the last month of published league schedule or no point will be given to any team (for exceptions see section "11.11 Match Re-scheduling" & "11.10.4 Umpires Absent")
- (e) Any umpire showing up 30 minutes or more after the scheduled start time shall be considered absent.
- (f) For absent or late umpires, fines shall be levied against the umpiring club as follows:**
 - 1. Two (2) points deduction for each absent umpire, umpire not present on the field within 30 minutes of the scheduled start time. If neither umpire is present in the field at the scheduled start time but makes it to the field within thirty (30) minutes of the scheduled start time, the captains may not refuse and umpires shall be paid in full.
 - 2. If the umpire(s) arrive after 30 minutes of the scheduled start time, the captain(s) may refuse and penalties shall be assessed as per absent umpires.
 - 3. **If absent umpires arrive later and both teams agree, they may still umpire the match. In this case, each umpire shall be paid full umpiring fee but their parent club shall be fined \$25.00 for each umpire arriving this late. Points shall not be deducted.**
 - 4. In addition to US \$25.00 (twenty-five) fine for each absent umpire, 2(two) points shall be deducted for each absent umpire. The penalties will be doubled for repeated violation (more than twice) of rule 11.10.3 (e).
 - 5. If team(s) defaulted on umpiring assignments during the last month of the published league schedule and when it was not possible to re- schedule the match (es), if and when determined by BACA, or when the umpires failed to show up for the re-scheduled match due to umpires no show for the regular scheduled match, the penalties shall double i.e., \$50.00 and 4 points, for each absent umpire.

4. Umpires Absent:

- (a) In the absence of both umpires, the match must be re-scheduled by the teams' involved and umpiring team to be notified of the same.
- (b) Failure on part of any team to reschedule the match after a reasonable effort (below) by the other or play the match after it has been re-scheduled shall be considered as forfeiture.
- (c) Unless the situation occurred during the month prior to the start of the last month of published schedule, the matches may not be re-scheduled and played during the last month of published schedule.
- (d) In situation(s) where re-scheduling is beyond control of involved teams, if and when determined by BACA, each affected team shall be awarded full match points.
- (e) Time permitted, matches may be re-scheduled during the last month of published schedule.

11.11 Rescheduling of matches:

- 1. Any team who must re-schedule a pre-scheduled match for reasons other than absent umpires will notify the other team as well as the team sending umpires and Secretary at least 72 hours in advance or the match shall be considered as "forfeited".
- 2. The rescheduled date has to be mutually agreed upon by both teams before the originally scheduled date and conveyed to the Secretary.
- 3. When two teams agree to reschedule a game, it will not be mandatory for the assigned umpiring teams to do the umpiring on the rescheduled date unless they volunteer to do so. The team requesting the rescheduling will be responsible for arranging neutral umpires for the rescheduled date. If, for some reason(s), the match could not be played by the BACA-specified deadline for Summer League games, both the teams will be awarded 0 points.
- 4. A match may not be re-scheduled twice.

5. No match can be re-scheduled to be held on a date past the last date of published Summer League schedule.
6. No match can be rescheduled due to inclement weather. Refer to 11.6.4 (d) above.

Reasonable Effort:

Defined as serving two written (E-mail acceptable) notices, one week apart if first notice is not acknowledged, to the counterpart with a copy forwarded to Secretary BACA and team sending umpires at the addresses registered with BACA.

11.12 Natural Calamity:

Time permitted, matches may be re-scheduled during and beyond the last date of published schedule.

11.13 Carried Over Penalty Points

The penalty points during the league and knockout tournament of any given season, if exceed from Five (5), shall be carried over to the following year. **Example:** If Team 'A' earns 5 penalty points or less during 2001, No point will be carried over to 2002. But if team 'A' earns 6 or more penalty points during 2001, all penalty points shall be carried over to 2002 as Negative start-up points.

11.14 Forfeiture of scheduled games

Teams will be allowed to forfeit one game during the summer season without any penalty. Any subsequent forfeiture will immediately result in the penalties outlined in section 11.22 (Appendix A).

All penalties will be immediately payable. An extra fine of \$25 per month will be applied in case the offending team fails to pay the fine on time.

The offending team will be allowed to continue as a regular member for the following season provided it has cleared all outstanding fines by the end of the season in which it was penalized.

If the fines are not paid by the due date (end of season) all Executives of that team will be barred from participating in any BACA activities for three years or for the time that the fines remain unpaid, whichever is less. They will also not be eligible to play for any other team in the running season even if they pay the dues. Non-Executives will be allowed to play for other teams in the running season.

11.15 Cricket Balls

BACA' shall purchase the cricket balls in bulk and upon payment provide to the teams. Cricket Ball review committee has approved "SG Test" as official cricket balls for Summer League season 2007.

11.16 Other Events

In addition to the Summer League, BACA Council also approved following events for 2007 cricket season. The format shall be chalked out by the tournament committee(s) event by event.

1) Twenty20 Cricket Blast:

This will be an open tournament in which any team can participate

2) July 4th Cricket Festival:

Teams playing in BACA Summer League will be divided into four groups named as Blue, Green, Red and Yellow for this tournament and play on a round robin format. A player must have played at least three (3) BACA Summer League matches during the ongoing season in order to qualify and play in this tournament.

3) Knockout:

This tournament will be held after the end of Summer League. All teams that participated in the BACA Summer League will be playing this tournament. The schedule will be drawn based on ranking in the Summer League. Refer to "Appendix C" for current season's knockout schedule.

4) Youth Cricket Activity:

An Under-19 team will be entered into Super 25 Summer League. In addition, various other activities related to development of youth cricket will be carried out.

11.17 Personnel Support

Each BACA registered team upon receipt of request must make available at least two personnel to help organize the event(s). Failure to do so may disqualify all members of that team(s) for selection in subsequent BACA representative team and events prior to that except for Summer League and its affiliated knockout and or play-off.

11.18 Selection Committee

BACA executives shall interview and select 3-member selection committee from amongst the potential candidates proposed by BACA council members.

11.19 **Disciplinary Issues**

The League Monitoring Committee (LMC) upon receipt shall investigate the complaint(s) and or report(s) and submit the findings along with suggestions / recommendations to executive committee for implementation.

11.20 **Suspended Players**

1. BACA teams must not allow any player(s) suspended by any league in North West Region to participate in BACA organized and / or endorsed games.
2. Teams failing to comply with rule 11.22.a will result in forfeiture of the game in which the suspended player (s) participated and a fine of \$50 will be imposed for each infraction. No team will be allowed to play any game until the fine is paid. Forfeiture rules will apply in case the fine is not paid

11.21 **The Result:**

1. A result can be achieved only if both teams have had the opportunity of batting for at least 20 overs, subject to the provisions of Clauses 4.1(b) and 4.2.2(b) unless one team has been all out in less than 20 overs or unless the team batting second scores enough runs to win in less than 20 overs. All matches, in whom both teams have not had an opportunity of batting for at least 20 overs, shall be declared no result.

2. **Tie**

In matches in which both teams have had the opportunity of batting for the agreed number of overs, subject to the provisions of Clauses 4.1(b) and 4.2.2(b) the team scoring the higher number of runs shall be the winner, If the scores are equal, the result shall be a tie and no account shall be taken of the number of wickets which have fallen.

3. **Delayed or Interrupted Matches - Calculation of the Target Score**

In matches where the second innings is reduced to less number of overs than the number of overs in the first innings, the target score shall be the number of overs to be bowled multiplied by the average runs scored per over by the team batted first. The average runs scored per over shall be the total runs scored divided by the maximum number of overs the team was entitled to bat, not the number of over the team actually batted.

11.22 **Match Points & Penalties**

Refer to "Appendix A" for points and penalties

11.23 **Awards**

Refer to "Appendix B" for a list of awards/trophies to be given out.

If the match ends in dispute and without any result, the point, if and when awarded, shall be decided by BACA / LMC upon investigation of submitted reports.

In case of an emergency situation, the LMC can waive any financial penalty imposed on any team. As an example, an Umpire may be held up in traffic or is injured while on his way to the game. The Team Captain will have to make a written request for the application to be considered. However, the penalty points will not be called into review or waived under any circumstances.
